

Enclosed you will find your 2014 Final Tax Bill. Your taxes for the year are calculated by taking the assessed value of your property and multiplying it by the respective tax rates. The assessed value of property is determined by MPAC (Municipal Property Assessment Corporation).

The current value assessment, or CVA, of a property is an estimate of the market value of a property at a fixed point in time (the valuation date), or the amount the property would sell for in an open market on a given date (i.e. in an arm's length sale between a willing buyer and a willing seller).

Amendments to the Assessment Act provide for a four-year assessment update cycle. The last valuation MPAC conducted took place in 2012. Any assessment increases between the 2012 valuation date and the previous 2008 valuation date are phased in over four years, with approximately one-quarter of the assessment change being applied in each of the four years (2013-2016)

Registered Charities:

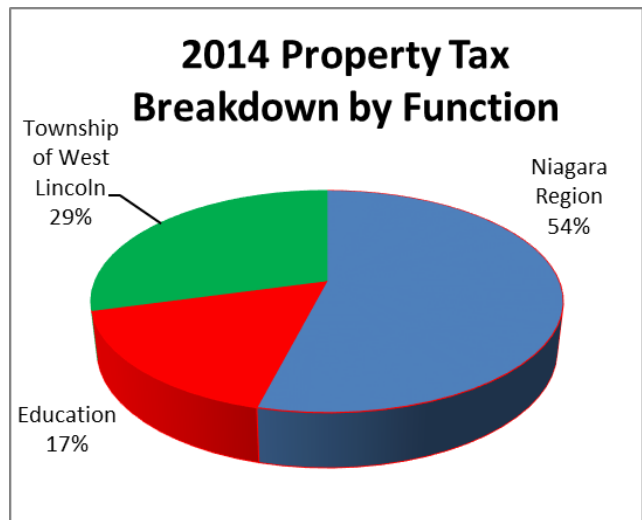
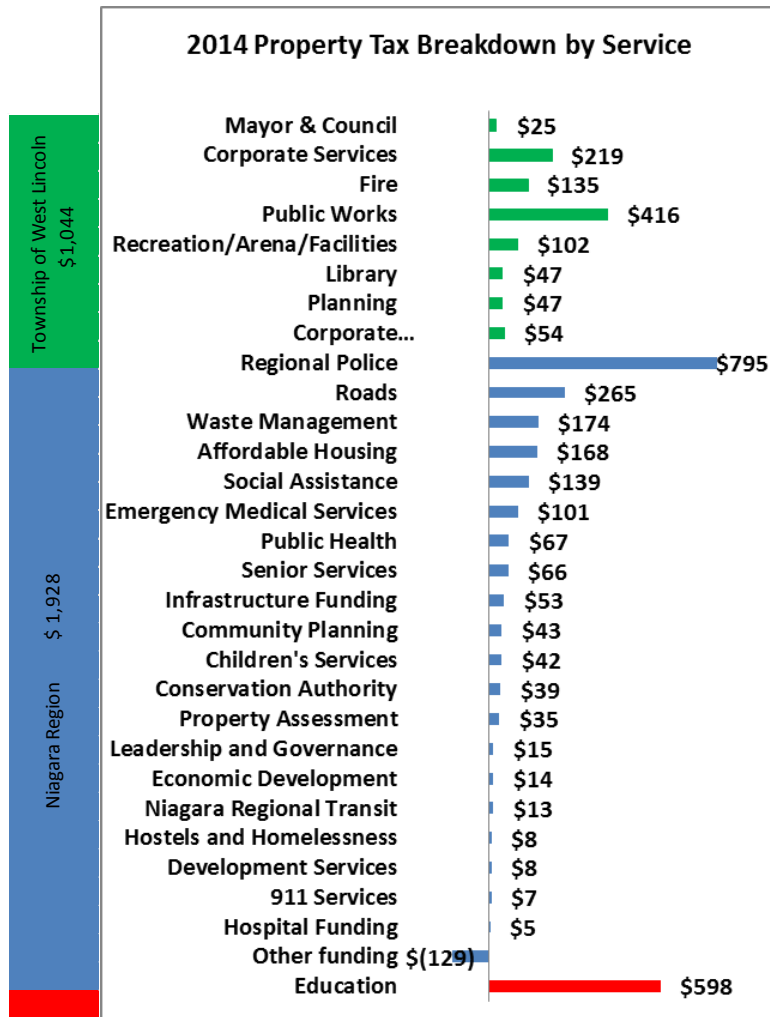

The Township of West Lincoln is responsible for collecting its own property taxes, as well as collecting regional taxes and school board taxes. West Lincoln Council approved a 2014 Operating Budget of \$7.4 million that included a 2.19% increase over the 2014 general tax levy. For 2014, the average residential assessment has increased to \$294,488 from \$286,060 in 2013. Based on average assessment year over year, the increase in taxes is \$9.11. Property owners within the Urban Boundary of Smithville pay an additional rate for sidewalks and streetlights. Total taxes for a property assessed at the average rate of \$294,488 would be \$3,569. The following charts breaks down the amount by service as well as by function.
