

NPCA MANDATE

The legislative mandate of the NPCA, as set out in Section 20 of the *Conservation Authorities Act*, is to establish and undertake programs designed to further the conservation, restoration, development and management of natural resources other than gas, oil, coal and minerals. The NPCA fulfills this mandate by implementing programs that:

- Improve the quality of lands and waters
- Contribute to public safety from flooding and erosion
- Provide for the acquisition of conservation and hazard lands
- Enhance the quality of life in its watershed by using its land for recreation, heritage preservation and conservation education

To meet this mandate, the NPCA is governed by “Members of Authority” (often referred to as the Board of Directors (Board)) as per Section 14 of the *Conservation Authorities Act*.

The Board Members shall approve all policies and procedures of the NPCA, approve the budget with or without revisions, give direction on priority of programs and projects and are generally responsible for other matters as required by the *Conservation Authorities Act* and Regulations.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to serve on the Board for the NPCA as a representative of the Township of West Lincoln, you must be 18 years of age or older and you must reside in or own property in the Township of West Lincoln. Please include a copy of your resume and any other documentation that will support your application.

Your application, resume and any supporting documentation may be submitted by mail, email or dropped off at the Township office at the address below by no later than June 12, 2019 at 4:30 pm. This item will be deliberated at the June 24th Council meeting. Council’s decision will then be sent to the Regional Municipality of Niagara for final approval.
